Bethel Lutheran Church Council Minutes, July 18, 2023

Attendees: Randy Baskerville, Jill Duncan, Jim Herr, Tom Hooper, Annette Lang, Sarah Manro, Mary Jo Mikulski, Steve Middleton, Linc Schneider, Harold Seamon. Guests: Tim Wuwert, Ros Demaree

Jim Herr called the meeting to order at 6:38, asking Linc Schneider to lead the council in an opening prayer.

Congregant Tim Wuwert made a presentation, asking that the cabinets in the southwest corner of the sanctuary be moved to the northeast corner when the sanctuary lights get changed. In their present location, they cover HVAC vents. A volunteer crew will be needed to empty the cabinets and load them on to furniture dollies. Permission was given.

Tim also pointed out that the worship script, slides and the information the AV booth receives is not always consistent, creating frustration among the volunteers. He asked that there be accountability and the problems corrected. Jim Herr agreed to talk with the office about correcting the problems.

Minutes

Jill Duncan moved, and Randy Baskerville seconded, to approve the June 16, 2024, minutes as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Finance Report

While there was a deficit in June, we are \$3,888 in the black year-to-date. The budget includes salary and benefits for a second pastor beginning in August, therefore finance reports will be more positive in coming months. Mary Jo Mikulski moved, and Jill Duncan seconded, to approve the submitted report. Motion passed unanimously.

Ministry Assignments

Annette Lang agreed to lead the Communications Ministry.

Officer Elections

Mary Jo Mikulski moved, and Steve Middleton seconded, to elect Jim Herr to a second one-year term as president. Motion passed unanimously. It was moved, and Sarah Manro seconded, to elect Mary Jo Mikulski to a second one-year term as vice president. Motion passed unanimously. Randy Baskerville moved, and Jill Duncan seconded, to elect Annette Lange to a one-year term as president. Motion passed unanimously.

Holly Eldridge Salary

Due to changes in the federal labor laws regarding exempt employees, the Executive Committee proposed moving Office Manager Holly Eldridge from a salaried to an hourly employee. She would be paid \$24 per hour, which is a 5 percent pay increase. Questions were raised about the number of hours the office is open. Under this change, the office manager would be required to work 35 hours per week. It was moved, and Steve Middleton seconded, to accept the Executive Committee proposal to pay Holly Eldridge \$24/hour with overtime paid at 1.5 times her hourly rate. The motion passed 8-1. Tom Hooper agreed to update Holly's employment agreement and ensure it follows the personnel manual.

Office Hours

Concerns were raised about the need for the church to be open more hours to the community, particularly on Mondays, though the pastoral team does not need to staff the office those days. This will involve updating the personnel manual. A motion to increase Pastor Doug's salary to be commensurate with the time he's working was tabled. Sarah Manro moved, and Annette Lang seconded, to have the office open 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Mondays and 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Fridays, in addition to the already scheduled hours on Tuesdays-Thursdays. Motion was tabled to the August meeting.

Fall Festival

It has been suggested that a Fall Festival replace the annual Trunk or Treat event on Oct. 26. This will be discussed at a future meeting.

Council Retreat

The council met in an all-day retreat July 13. Discussions from it will be revisited at the August council meeting.

Call Committee

Jim Herr and Mary Jo Mikulski will meet with the Call Committee on July 22, sharing information they have learned through discussions with NALC staff regarding Bethel's call.

Marilyn's Place Board

Marilyn's Place has asked Bethel to appoint someone to a seat on the nonprofit's board of directors. Randy Baskerville will make a call for volunteers at worship July 21.

Go and Tell Ministries

Given the time and leadership Go and Tell Ministries provided at the July 13 council retreat, Tom Hooper asked Missions to consider a gift to that ministry.

The meeting adjourned by consent at 8:22 p.m.
